Project Management Vocabulary



What is a Project?*

- A temporary group activity designed to produce a unique product, service or result.
- Defined beginning and end
- Defined scope and resources
- Not a routine operation, but a specific set of operations designed to accomplish a specific goal
- Often includes people who don't usually work together, sometimes from different organizations and across multiple geographies
- Must be expertly managed to deliver the on-time, on-budget results


What is Project Management?*

- The application of knowledge, skills and techniques to execute projects effectively and efficiently
- A strategic competency for organizations, enabling them to tie project results to business goals
- Project management <u>processes</u> fall into five groups:
 - Initiating
 - Planning
 - Executing
 - Monitoring and Controlling
 - Closing
